THE ALIEN ALLIANCE (Application Activity)

Set up: Print the "Alien Alliance" cards on 8½ x 11 cardstock and cut apart. There are separate versions for younger and older kids. Each alien will be on 2 different cards. Place a circle of scotch tape on the back of each card.

Say: In today's story, Jehoshaphat (*pronounced: Juh-ho-suh-fat*) ran into some big-time trouble. What was it? (*Allow kids to answer.*) That's right—the enemy army was marching to destroy Judah. But instead of freaking out, Jehoshaphat stayed cool. He told the people of Judah about the trouble and prayed to God for wisdom. We're going to play a game right now that will help us do that same thing.

Directions: Place the "Alien Alliance" cards face down on the floor in the middle of the group. Without looking, have the kids choose a card and stick it to their forehead so that everyone else can see it, but they can't. Tell the kids that they have to find and form an alliance with their matching alien. (If there is an odd number of kids, the leader will need to play too.) Allow the kids to stand up and mingle with each other. They can **only** ask each other yes or no questions about their alien. When all of the kids have found their match, have them sit down together. Next, tell the kids to think of some trouble they're facing or a problem they're having. Have the kids share what it is with their partner. If you would like to, and if time allows, you can play several rounds of matching and sharing.

For Older Kids: When the alliance is finished sharing with each other, allow them to pray with their partner. They can pray that God would give their partner wisdom to deal with the trouble they shared.

For Younger Kids: When the alliance is finished sharing with each other, ask if anyone would like to share their trouble or problem with the whole group. Afterwards, open them in a prayer. Pray that God would give them wisdom to deal with the specific troubles that were shared.

Say: When Jehoshaphat was in trouble, God gave him wisdom through another person. Maybe we can help each other in the same way.

Directions: Allow kids to share their trouble or problem with the entire group. Encourage the other kids to suggest some things that might help.

METEOR SHOWER (Bible Memorization Activity)

Set up: Use tape to create a square on the floor that is about 8 feet (2.5 meters) in width. Crumple 10 pieces of paper into balls.

Directions: Place the Bible verse sign in the middle of the group and read it carefully with your kids several times so they can begin to memorize it. Today's Bible verse says:

"If any of you needs wisdom, you should ask God for it. He will give it to you." James 1:5

When ready, have the kids stay seated but spread out within the square. Tell them that the square is their space station and the crumpled pieces of paper are meteors. Their mission is to protect the space station from getting hit by the meteors. Count to 3 and throw all 10 meteors simultaneously into the air above the space station. The kids will have to catch or swat the meteors out of the air, but some meteors will inevitably get through. Once a meteor has touched the

floor, it cannot be moved. Count how many meteors landed in the space station and have the group recite the verse together that many times. Continue playing rounds for as long as you would like.

Note: Depending on the number of kids in your group, you may want to adjust the number of meteors up or down.

Question: Do you think God has ever given you wisdom about something or helped you figure something out? What happened?


EMOJI PRAYERS (Group Prayer Activity)

Directions: Place a box of washable markers in the middle of your group. Allow each kid to choose one marker. Next, place the "Emoji Examples" sign in the middle of the group. An "emoji" is a small icon used to express an emotion. Tell the kids in your group to draw an emoji on the palm of their hand that best describes how they are feeling at that moment. They can use the examples from the card or they can make up their own emoji.

When finished, tell the kids to close their hand until you ask them to share their emoji with the group. One at a time, ask the kids in your group to show what emoji they drew. Ask them why they are feeling that way and how you can pray for them. Some kids might share praises while other kids might share struggles. As each kid shares, write down their needs or requests. When everyone has shared, open the group in prayer. Encourage the kids to pray aloud for themselves and for one another based on what they shared during the activity.

You might need to start saving money in a jar or make some other preparation, but if you choose it and make a plan, it'll happen – and when it does, it will be a great reminder that good things take time!

Good Things Take Time

Think about It

Walk down the aisles of the grocery store and you'll see a lot of products that promise they are "instant" something or other. We like things fast! Drive through meals, fast passes at the amusement park, escalators, and one day delivery! If we ever figured out time travel, we'd likely use it to skip time and speed things up rather than going back in time to study history! A man once prayed, "God, give me patience, but give it to me now." We are naturally so impatient, but the reality is that good things take time. Instant macaroni and cheese doesn't taste as good as a meal that takes time to prepare. We may be in a hurry, but God isn't. He is working to make us everything He designed us to be, but that process takes time. If we want what is best for us, we too need to learn to slow down and be patience. Good things come to the patient. Impatient people miss out on a lot.



Name of the Game: Patience Card Game

Needed: A standard deck of cards (or 2 or 3 to add more fun!)
How to Play: Give seven cards randomly to every player. The rest go in the center of the table face down. Turns go youngest to oldest. On a player's turn, they first draw one card from the center pile and then can play as many cards as they are able to in front of any player. If they can't play any cards, they draw a second card, but their turn is over. If the discard pile is used up, they can take a random card from any player's hand! Players may place up to two cards face up on the table in front of them to start a stack. This may be on their first and second turn, or they can wait to start the second pile later when they are stuck! Once cards are placed, they may not be moved. Similar to solitaire, cards are stacked so that you can see the number on the top of bottom of the cards. Cards may be placed on the top or bottom of any stack, as long as it the next card in order, and it doesn't matter if the order goes up or down!

OPTIONAL: Stacks must be one black and one red. (Suits don't matter.)






