The Book of James: Pray for Each Other

BIG IDEA: God calls us to share our struggles with one another and to pray for each other.

BIBLE BASIS: James 5; Ezra 9-10

KEY VERSE: "So confess your sins to one another. Pray for one another so that you might be

healed." James 5:16a (NIrV)



PRAYER STOMP (Application Activity)

Say: The Book of James tells us to pray for one another. That's exactly what Ezra and the Israelites did in our story for today. That's also what we're going to do for each other right now.

Directions: Ask the kids to make up a "Bonkers" action. It could be something like making a funny noise or walking around and clucking like a chicken. Next, give each kid in your group a sticky-note and a pen. Tell the kids to write their name on their sticky note. While the kids are writing their name, write the word "Bonkers" on three more sticky notes. When finished, place all of the sticky notes (including the three "Bonkers") spread out face down in the middle of the circle with the sticky side up. Choose a kid to go first. While seated, have them stomp on one of the notes and then pick up their foot so that the others can read what it says. If it has a name, have the kid whose name is on the sticky note answer the question below. If it says "Bonkers," have the entire group perform the pre-determined "Bonkers" action, then allow that kid to stomp another note. After each "Bonkers" action has been performed, allow the kids to make up a new one.

Question: Do have some trouble or a problem that you need prayer for? What is it and how can we pray for you?

Encourage the kids to listen carefully to all of the prayer requests, but tell them to pay special attention to the person whose name they stomped on. When everyone has shared, open the group in prayer. Allow the kids to take turns praying for the person whose name they chose. Finally, ask the kids to continue praying for their person throughout the coming week.

PASS THE PLANET (Bible Memorization Activity)

Directions: Place the Bible verse sign in the middle of the group and read it carefully with your kids several times so they can begin to memorize it. Practice saying it together a few times. When everyone is ready, turn the sign over so they can no longer read it. Today's Bible verse says:

"So confess your sins to one another. Pray for one another so that you might be healed." James 5:16a

Show the kids a beach ball and tell them to pretend it's a planet. The object of the game is to keep the planet in space until the group can recite the entire verse from memory. Kids must use their hands or other body parts to bump the ball in the air to each other. They cannot catch and throw it. Every time someone bumps the ball, the group must say one word of the verse. If the ball hits the ground before the entire verse has been recited, pick it up and start over from the beginning. Continue playing until you get through the verse several times. If you need to make it harder, tell the kids they can use any body part except for their hands. For younger kids, consider using a balloon instead of a beach ball.

Question: What kind of things can you say this coming week that will help build people up instead of tearing them down?

SHARK MAN (Group Prayer Activity)

Activity:

Directions: Have your group sit in a circle. Place the "Shark Man" game sheet in the middle of the group. Play "Shark Man" the same way you would play "Hangman." The game sheet will have blanks for the words (not including the Book name or numbers) in the following Bible verse:

"Love your neighbor as you love yourself." Matthew 22:39

What you need:

If kids guess a letter that is in the puzzle, fill it in the appropriate blank. If they guess a letter that is not in the puzzle, draw one part of a man (head, body, arm, leg, etc.) attached to the parachute. For younger kids, you may want to include a circle for each hand and foot in order to give them more chances. If they can say the verse before the man is completed, they win. If the man is completed before they can say the verse correctly, the game is over. Finish the verse for them.

Say: Matthew 22:39 says that we should love other people the same way that we want to be loved. One of the ways we can do that is by praying for them. Let's think about the people we know and how we can pray for them. Do you know anyone who could use prayer for something?

Directions: Allow the kids to talk about who they want to pray for. When everyone has had a chance to share, lead your group in a closing prayer. Encourage the kids to pray for the person or people they shared about.




Name of the Game: Scattergories Needed: Nothing but creativity!
